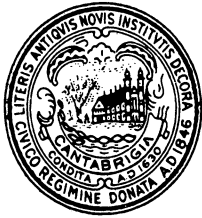



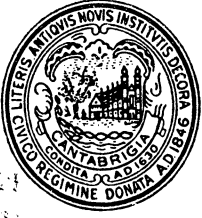

Dear Mr. Corcoran:

This is to request the transfer of \$2,900.00 from A1, Permanent Employees, to G4, Motor Vehicles, for the purchase of one 1972 delivery van.

The present van owned by the library has traveled 54,000 miles and is of a 1963 vintage, 10 years old in June 1973.

Body rot has set in everywhere, but more importantly, regular breakdowns and repairs appear to be common. At the present, brakes and wheel alignment are necessary -- transmission work will be required soon -- a van sticker may be difficult to obtain -- any further expenditure repairing this van is extravagant and wasteful.

The library van does the following:

- a. Weekly delivery of books to over 20 shut-ins.
- b. Monthly delivery of books to the City Infirmary.
- c. Monthly delivery of books to all public senior homes.
- d. Monthly delivery of books to 7 drop-in centers.
- e. Monthly delivery of books to 10 nursing homes.
- f. Interlibrary loans between branches.
- g. City Hall and other pick-ups for administration.


