- WHEREAS: James was the beloved husband of the late Frances (Doherty); and
- WHEREAS: James's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his daughters, Ellen Anderson, Patricia Brennan, Mary Anne Brennan and Jane Pope, his sons, Thomas, William and David, his sixteen grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; and
- WHEREAS: James will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it
