- WHEREAS: There is a growing awareness of the need to know how to administer "The Heimlich" maneuver which has saved the lives of thousands of people who found themselves in a choking situation; and
- WHEREAS: The presence in eating establishments of a tactfully displayed poster illustrating the Heimlich maneuver would be a healthful and helpful aid; and
- WHEREAS: The Kiwanis Club of Cambridge has indicated its willingness to make such framed posters available at a reasonable cost, and indicates that the proceeds from same will be used for specifically accountable charitable causes; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council goes on record as respecting the fact that as many people as possible of every age should know how to administer the Heimlich maneuver and supports the desire of the Kiwanis Club of Cambridge to make this knowledge available through poster presence in eating establishments in Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a duly engrossed copy of this Resolution for transmittal to Douglas E. Poole, President of the Kiwanis Club of Cambridge.
