WHEREAS: Three distinguished women -- Barbara Ackermann, Jamie Ann Sabino, and Sarah Browning -- will be honored by Citizens for Participation in Political Action (CPPAX) on December 4, 1992; and

WHEREAS: The awards to these outstanding women recognizes, for all of them, the important role in the community of outspoken and progressive activists; and

WHEREAS: Barbara Ackermann, the first woman Mayor of Cambridge, has continued her active community contribution since leaving public office, especially by championing outstanding, affordable health care for all the citizens of Cambridge and strengthening health care for women; and

WHEREAS: Jamie Ann Sabino, the President of the Women's Bar Association of Massachusetts and an elected Democratic State Committee member, is co-Chair of the Judicial Consent for Minors Lawyer referral Panel and works with minors who are pregnant and seek legal help; and

WHEREAS: Sarah Browning, an anti-Apartheid activist, was a leader of alumni efforts to pressure Harvard to divest from South Africa and of other anti-apartheid efforts and has organized around public housing issues; and

WHEREAS: All three women have had an active association with CPPAX, an organization whose founding principles were to bring peace through grass-roots efforts and which has continued to organize around issues of national and domestic importance; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council admires the outstanding work of Ms. Ackermann, Ms. Sabino, and Ms. Browning and the organization honoring them; now therefore be it

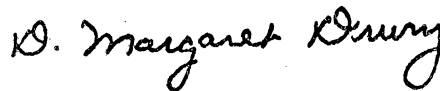
