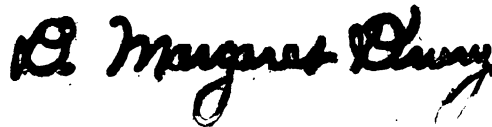

WHEREAS: Cambridge has many organizations and individuals promoting issues of peace and justice both locally and globally.
