IN CITY COUNCIL
March 11, 1985

- WHEREAS: The people of Cambridge and their representative on the City Council believe in the rights of workers to organize and to engage in collective bargaining; and
- WHEREAS: The farm workers in California, under the leadership of Cesar Chavez and the United Farm Workers of America and the AFL-CIO, have seen the California Agriculture Labor Relations Act decimated through budget cuts and an administration biased toward growers' interests; and
- WHEREAS: More than 6300 farm workers are owed over \$72 million in back wages because of the backlog of cases to be handled by the California Agriculture Labor Relations Board; and
- WHEREAS: The United Farm Workers of America has called for a renewed international boycott of California table grapes; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council endorses the farm workers' boycott of California table grapes and calls upon all citizens of Cambridge to support this boycott.
