SUMMARY OF THE BIRK/ACN ZONING PETITION FOR EASTERN CAMBRIDGE

Four years ago, a group of citizens – concerned with the intense development occurring in the city, especially East Cambridge and Alewife -- submitted a proposal for City-wide rezoning under the banner of Growth Management. Their primary concerns centered on too much density and traffic from new development. One result of that initiative was the City-wide rezoning passed by the City Council last February.

The City Council chose to defer plans for both East Cambridge and Alewife in the February rezoning. Today, there are two East Cambridge zoning petitions before the City Council and the Planning Board. One plan, approved by the Planning Board, had its origins in the ECAPS study committee for Eastern Cambridge and the \$500,000 consultant planing study. Unfortunately, the amount of new development was very high and would produce exactly the opposite of sound Growth Management. The North Point area could have a buildout of 6 million square feet of new buildings with
