Cambridge -- Tracy Gallagher will begin his two-year term as the Chamber's Chairman of the Board in January. A committee of board members nominated Tracy, and the Board approved his nomination by vote last spring. As chairman, his responsibilities will include overseeing the Board of Directors and working with the Chamber president in determining policies, procedures, and in the organization of daily operations.

Tracy is currently the Director of Administration at TFS, New England's largest regional accounting and management services firm. In addition to accounting, auditing, and tax services, the firm also offers consulting in many areas, such as computers, employee benefit plans, personal financial planning, human resources, real estate, litigation support, international trade, and mergers and acquisitions. As Director of Administration, Tracy must oversee personnel, recruiting, marketing, facilities, support services, areas of finance, and special projects.

In the Carter Administration, Tracy held various positions, including Director of Campaign Services at the Democratic National Committee, and Liason for Democratic Constituency Groups at the White House. From 1980 until he joined TFS in 1984, he was President of the Business and Industry Association of New Hampshire, the state affiliate of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, as well as the National Association of Manufacturers.
