RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council invites people of all ages in Cambridge to join in the day's activities.

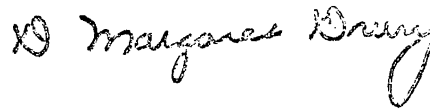

WHEREAS: On February 5th, 2007, the Cambridge City Council declared Cambridge as a “City of Peace” in 2007 in part to recognize the 25th anniversary of the Cambridge Peace Commission; and

WHEREAS: The resolution invites Cambridge’s public institutions (including our schools, libraries, youth centers, police, arts council and city departments) and neighbors, private organizations and civic institutions (including our universities, cultural centers, community agencies, religious/spiritual institutions and neighborhoods to join in this recognition making connections to peacebuilding through activities, exhibitions and resource sharing; and

WHEREAS: As part of this year, Cambridge City Hall and the Senior Center will open their doors to people of all ages to celebrate Peace Day, Saturday June 2nd from 1-5 pm; and

WHEREAS: Peace Day will include performances of music, poetry, dance, spoken word, and theater and the opportunity for citizens of Cambridge to express their hopes and messages for peacemaking; and

WHEREAS: Peace day will have activities for participation including making peace flags, workshops in the healing arts, peace games, and talking with families about peace in the midst of war with military families; and

WHEREAS: Outside on the sidewalk, Peace Day will include resource tables from peace groups, community organizations and justice workers such as neighborhood violence-prevention projects, Community Dispute Resolution Center, Mass Peace Action and Cambridge United for Peace with Justice; and

WHEREAS: Some of the community groups leading activities on that day include True Story Theater, Peace Games, Dances of Universal Peace, and Underground Railroad Theater; and

WHEREAS: On June 2nd, people will be welcomed on the steps of City Hall at 1 PM and at 4:30 are invited to make a human peace symbol on the lawn of City Hall; now therefore be it
