IN CITY COUNCIL  
May 10, 1982

- WHEREAS: Section 17-16(m) of the City Code, as inserted by Ordinance No. 824 of September 10, 1973, provides for the recycling of newspapers but is not currently being implemented; and
- WHEREAS: An effective recycling program would save energy, conserve natural resources, and produce significant savings and revenue for the city; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Energy Commission, in its final report of June 23, 1981, recommended establishing such a recycling program; and
- WHEREAS: Other Massachusetts communities, including Belmont Longmeadow, Marblehead, and Newton, have had successful experiences with recycling; and
- WHEREAS: The Acting Commissioner of Public Works recently expressed the view that a successful recycling program could be established in Cambridge; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager appoint a citizens' committee of neighborhood residents to work with the Commissioner of Public Works to develop a program for recycling glass, metals, cardboard, and especially newspapers.
