Ordered,

Willard, Elizabeth L. and Catherine H. Bond, Andrew N. Wyeth, Albert H. Hews, Robert J. Melledge and Daniel W. Job, Jr., and all other persons interested as owners, proprietors, tenants, occupants, or otherwise, in said land, that they cut off, pull down, remove, and carry away all buildings, erections, and obstructions of every sort standing on and projecting over the lines of said continuation of Huron avenue through Wyeth and other streets and private ways and private lands as established by the resolve and order aforesaid, or move and set back the same to the said lines, and vacate and surrender the land and premises taken as aforesaid, on or before the twentieth day of July now next ensuing.

And in default thereof, the City of Cambridge will forthwith enter upon said land, and cause all buildings, erections and obstructions standing on and projecting over the lines of said continuation of Huron avenue, as established by the resolve and order aforesaid, to be cut off, pulled down, removed and carried away, or sold in such manner as said board shall deem expedient, or to be moved and set back to said line, and the land vacated and surrendered to said city.
