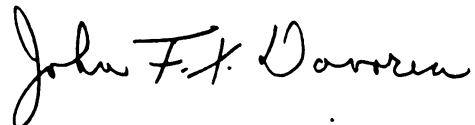

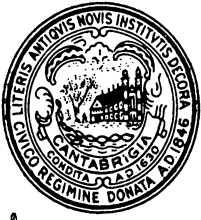

The corporation intends to achieve these purposes in the following charitable and educational ways:

- (1) By investigating the working conditions of women, particularly women office workers; and
- (2) By identifying and exposing the sources of the present patterns of discrimination against women workers, especially women office workers; and
- (3) By educating women office workers and other women workers about their rights under the law; and
- (4) By encouraging and supporting women workers, particularly women office workers, to take action to secure their civil rights; and
- (5) By running educational forums, panels, seminars, and other programs, addressed to the needs of women workers, especially women office workers; and
- (6) By providing a meeting place and other resources for women workers, and especially women office workers, who are attempting to secure their civil rights; and
- (7) By working with groups that have similar goals; and
- (8) By engaging in any and all charitable and educational activities permitted by Chapter 180 of the General Laws of Massachusetts, as limited by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as it now exists, and may hereafter be amended.

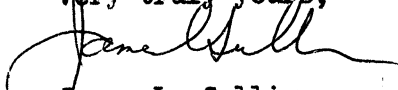
