To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report Item No. 29 relative to an inventory and needs assessment of all Water Department vehicles, enclosed please find a "Vehicle Inventory/Status Report" dated October 1987.

During the budget preparation process for FY88 a similar evaluation was conducted, at which time the Water Department recommended a replacement schedule of three (3) new vehicles each year. This type of routine turnover of vehicles would result in an average fleet age of about nine (9) years and a typical trade-in mileage of 60,000 to 80,000 miles for most vehicles. The City Council subsequently appropriated funds for the purchase of three new vehicles in FY88. The Water Department recently accepted bids on one sedan, one van, and one dump truck, which will result in trade-ins of vehicles No. 5, No. 10 and No. 14 as indicated on the enclosed report.

The Water Department also operates its own vehicle maintenance garage for all routine lubrication, fluid changes, tune-ups, exhaust system replacements, etc. Major repairs such as body work, front-end work and engine re-building are contracted out.

Based on our in-house repair capabilities and a replacement schedule of three vehicles each year, the Water Department will be able to maintain its fleet with an overall good condition rating.
