

City of Cambridge.

In Common Council, Oct. 10, 1860

Ordered, The Committee on Roads and Bridges which was directed, by an Order of Sept. 5th "to examine the several draw bridges within the City of Cambridge and ascertain whether the draws of the same are of lawful width, and report upon the subject to the City Council," has considered the subject, and would respectfully Report:-

That the draw of Union Point Bridge will, when completed, in conjunction with the City of Charlestown, be 32 feet in width; the new draw in Canal Bridge, 36 feet; the two openings in West-Boston Bridge 31 feet each; the draw in the River Street Bridge 31 feet; that in the Bridge on Western Avenue 20½ feet and that in the "Gravel Bridge" 29 feet.

The two last-mentioned should be thirty feet in width; but, inasmuch as Brighton will not co-operate with the City of Cambridge in any matters pertaining to the bridges connecting Cambridge with Brighton, the Committee deems it inexpedient to take any action at the present time.
