The Cambridge City Council has been on record for many years as unalterably opposing any and all Inner Belt highways through the City of Cambridge, and in particular the proposed Brookline-Elm route;

BE IT RESOLVED:

that this Council membership go on record as continuing the previous policies of the past Councils, on the issue of highways through Cambridge;

AND WHEREAS

House Bill 4540 of the Massachusetts General Court which calls for a halt of all major highway construction within route #128 will be heard on Tuesday, February, 3, 1970;

BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT the Cambridge City Council support House Bill 4540 by sending a representative to be heard at the hearing; and

BE IT RESOLVED

that the City Council requests all Cambridge Citizens ~~and City employees~~ who are interested in increasing the housing supply in the City as well as those interested in preservation of the environment and in pollution control, be present at the hearing of House Bill 4540 at the Massachusetts State House on February 3, 1970, in room 423, probably at 10:30 a.m.
