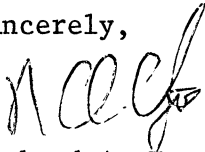
Enclosed is a proposed draft of a proclamation to be offered to Amy Shapiro who is leaving YMCA professional service to pursue a new career path in late September.
