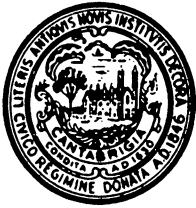

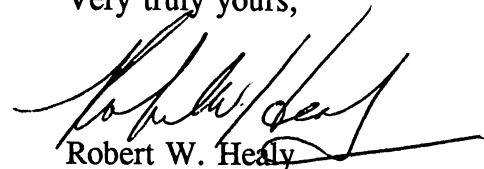

In response to Awaiting Report Item No. 33, regarding traffic signals at Old Sixth Street and Broadway, please be advised that currently the signals in the Kendall Square area are in normal operation between the hours of 5:30 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. During the remainder of the evening hours (10:00 p.m. - 5:30 a.m.) they operate on a flash mode. The signal at the Mid-Block Connector (Old Sixth Street) and Broadway has a pushbutton for the pedestrian phase while in full operation. The pedestrian phase is disabled during the flash mode for safety reasons.
