To the Members of the City Council:

Lambda, the lesbian, gay and bisexual student organization at Harvard Law School, respectfully requests the permission of the Cambridge City Council to hold a peaceful public assembly on city property.

The assembly we propose would take place on Monday, October 9, 1995, from 12:30 - 2:30 p.m., in the vacant, triangle-shaped parking area between Massachusetts Avenue and Harvard Street, across from the Inn at Harvard at 1201 Mass. Ave.

The purpose of the assembly is to draw public attention to Amendment 2, the anti-gay initiative passed by the State of Colorado, and Sidley & Austin, the law firm representing Colorado and Amendment 2 before the U.S. Supreme Court on October 10, 1995. Sidley & Austin will be interviewing Harvard Law School students at the Inn at Harvard that morning as part of their fall interviewing process.

We expect about fifty people to assemble in the parking area, where they will hold signs and listen to several speakers. We would like to use a small public address system. We will not interrupt vehicles or pedestrian traffic in any manner.
