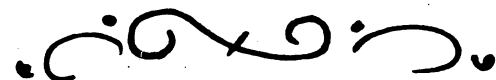
☺ To Frank, My Heart and Soul ☺

- I knew I had found a safe place in his arms when I was nineteen years old! He asked me to marry him after our third date, and I accepted without hesitation. Family and well-meaning friends gave us many reasons to change our minds, but we knew we were meant for each other, and our love flourished!
- He was well named! his honesty, directness, high standards, and, sometimes misinterpreted Irish wit, often surprised people, but his was a proud man with simple needs. Cris remembers the time Mom Grandpa and him went skiing at King Ridge. He told Cris he was a better skier and since that time He would always say, "Hey Cris I beat you at King Ridge."

My most recent memory of my grandfather was when my Mom, my older brother, Adam, and I were standing in his hospital room. My Mom was thanking him for all the special things he had done for her. Like wash^{ing} the kitchen floors, do^{ing} the dishes, walking the dogs, and buying her a cassette player because hers broke and he knew how much she liked to lie in the sun and listen to her tapes. Later on that night she told me that she forgot to thank him for the time he drove her to the hospital when she was pregnant with me. He waited patiently peaking around the corner every so often to see what was going on. She finally gave birth to me and Grandpa was ecstatic to have a granddaughter. I thank him with her.

Although this is a very sad day for me I remember the times Grandpa said he was just waiting for a miracle. This, to me, was God's plan and my Grandpa's miracle.

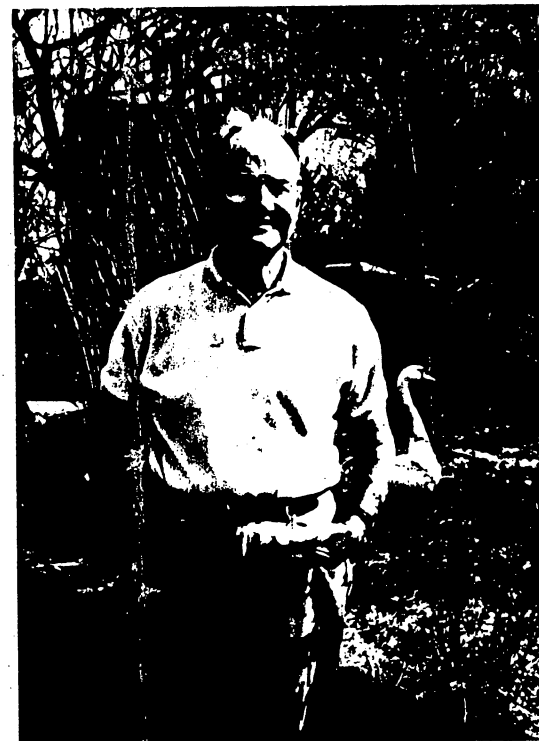

Adam, Aubri, and Cris were at his
bedside.

He was born in Cambridge,

(deceased).

After graduation, Frank enlisted
in the U.S. Navy, completed pre-
flight training in Chapel Hill,
