WHEREAS: The Pughs have sought to beautify City owned lands and otherwise "forgotten State property," which lies between Binney Street and Edwin Land Boulevard, as part of the "adopt a highway or by-way" plan; and

WHEREAS: The Pughs have spent countless hours on their project to improve the area for all seasons; and

WHEREAS: The Pughs have received support from a variety of entities and individuals, including, but not limited to, the following: the City of Cambridge, Jack Kelly, George Fernandez and their crews; COM Electric, Peter Diamond and John Schanda; Massachusetts Highway Department, Commissioner Bedingfield, Michael Swanson and Hadrian Millon; M.D.C., Commissioner Bhatti and Frank Fausher; Boston Truck Company, Ray Bigelow; Roland Institute; Howard Johnson's Hotel, Paul Dunleavy; Walter and Edward Sullivan; Robert Jones; Center for Integrative Psychotherapy, Dr. Daniel Brown; Professor Miquel Leibovich; and Peter Ponds; and

WHEREAS: It is the Council's hope and desire that the Pugh's efforts will inspire others to adopt similar projects within our City and elsewhere; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the corner of Binney Street and Land Boulevard be named "Pugh's Corner," and that the City Manager be requested that an appropriate marker be erected to identify this area; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to notify the Pughs of the Council action and to arrange a suitable dedication ceremony; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk send engrossed copies of this order to all that contributed to this project as a sign of the City Council's appreciation.
