1. How many C.E.T.A. positions have been abolished?
2. How many will be abolished in the foreseeable future?
3. How much C.E.T.A. funding is available now?
4. How much will be available in the foreseeable future?
5. What agencies are affected by the reduction in C.E.T.A. slots?
6. Which agencies will be affected by C.E.T.A. slot reductions in the foreseeable future?
7. What is the policy of the city in terms of giving notice to C.E.T.A. employees who are to be laid off? Specifically, how much time are they given as a notice?
8. What entitlements accrue to laid off C.E.T.A. workers with respect to unemployment compensation?
9. What steps are taken to help laid off C.E.T.A. workers acquire private sector or other public sector employment?
