John Albert Clark on January 12, 1974 gave his life in the performance of his duty as a member of the Cambridge Fire Department, and

WHEREAS:

John Albert Clark was a life long resident of Cambridge, the son of John F. Clark and Agnes Dolan, a graduate of Cambridge High and Latin School in the class of 1934 and received the Silver Star for his gallantry in action as a Corporal with the Second Armored Division of General Patton's Third Army in World War II, and

WHEREAS:

John Albert Clark entered the Fire Department in 1944 and served Engine Company 7 for thirteen years prior to his assignment to Engine Company 6 in 1957, and

WHEREAS:

John Albert Clark was a dedicated firefighter who by his courage and loyalty brought honor to the service which he loved and gave his life in the defense of the lives and property of the people of Cambridge, now therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That this City Council in behalf of the citizens of Cambridge pay humble tribute to this dedicated family man who distinguished himself on the field of battle and died a heroic death as he answered his last alarm, be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Clerk be and hereby is instructed to send a copy of this resolution to the family of John Albert Clark to record for all time our sympathy in their hour of sorrow.

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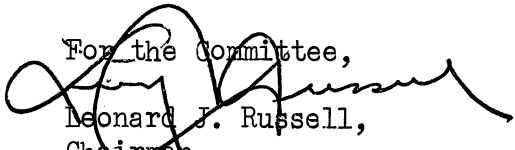
