WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Frank Wilczek, a physicist at M.I.T., was awarded the 2004 Nobel Prize in Physics, an award he shares with two other American scientists, David J. Gross and H. David Politzer; and

WHEREAS: The Nobel Prize was awarded to the three researchers because of their theoretical discoveries on the color force or the strong force, which is dominant in the atomic nucleus acting between the quarks inside the proton and neutron; and

WHEREAS: Mr. Wilczek received his bachelor's degree from the University of Chicago and his doctorate in physics from Princeton University and has been employed at M.I.T. for five years; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record extending its congratulations to Frank Wilczek for being a recipient of the 2004 Nobel Prize in Physics; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Frank Wilczek on behalf of the entire City Council.
