An Ordinance

In Amendment of an Ordinance
entitled "An Ordinance in relation
to giving notice of intention to build"

Be it ordained by the City Council
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Whoever shall intend to erect a
building, fence, or wall, the
whole or part of which is to be
placed upon or within ten feet
of any one of the streets, lanes, squares,
or alleys of the city, shall first
apply to the City Engineer for
information as to the line and
grade of said street, lane, square
or alley; and it shall be the
duty of the City Engineer to furnish
the necessary information to such
applicant, if in his power to do so;
but if not, he shall proceed
without delay to ascertain and
determine the correct line and

grade of such street, lane, square
or alley, and place the same upon
record in his office. In default of
the application required by this
Ordinance, the City shall be
discharged from all responsibility
for damages of any kind what-
soever, resulting from such default.
