Life came to a close for William Henry Crocker on May 11, 1969 ending an outstanding career in the municipal service of the City of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:-

William H. Crocker entered the service of the city on September 3, 1940 as an Assistant Fire Alarm Operator and was appointed Fire Alarm Operator on June 6, 1954, and served his country in the United States Navy from October 5, 1942 until September 22, 1945, and

WHEREAS:-

William H. Crocker was appointed City Electrician on March 15, 1957 and in that capacity performed an outstanding service to the City of Cambridge being responsible for the maintenance of the radio communication system of the Police Department and the installation of all traffic control lights in the City of Cambridge, and

WHEREAS:-

In the death of William H. Crocker the City of Cambridge has lost a conscientious and devoted public servant who carried out his duties and responsibilities with patience and good judgment, therefore be it
