Gentlemen:-

In accordance with an order of the City Council requesting "the Superintendent of Public Buildings to prepare plans and specifications for additions and alterations of the Agassiz School", I hereby submit the following report.

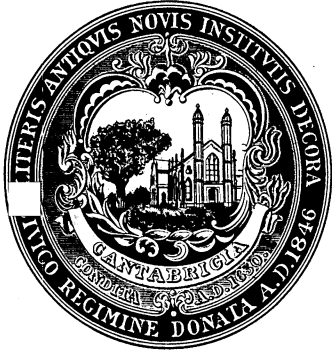
On the present site of the schoolhouse, it is possible to build an extension of four class rooms, with an assembly hall on the first floor with a seating capacity of three hundred and twenty-five.

With this extension there will be in all, eleven classrooms, principal's office, waiting room and teachers' room. Provision has also been made for improving the lighting and heating of the present building.

For the building of this proposed addition with the alterations necessary in the present building, it is estimated that the cost will be thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.).

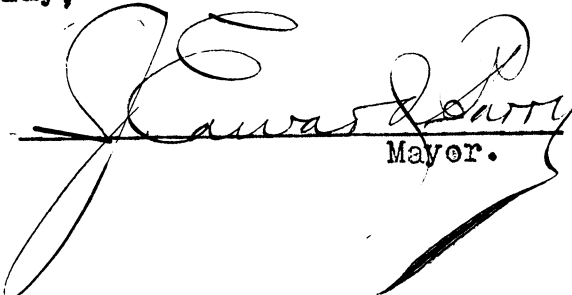

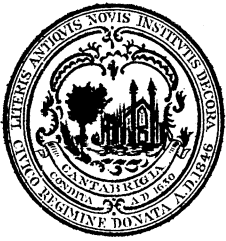

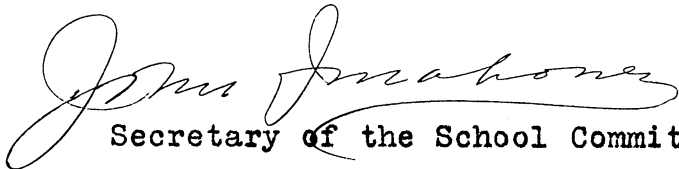

To the Honorable, the City Council
of the City of Cambridge:-

At a meeting of the School Committee, held on Wednesday, December 10, 1913, it was voted:-

"That the City Council be requested to purchase for school purposes the property on Sacramento Street immediately adjoining the Agassiz School, and the two pieces of property extending on Oxford Street from the school to Wendell Street; that further, it be requested to provide for the equipment of the so-called Wardwell House for school use; it being understood that the entire cost of above shall not exceed \$30,000."
