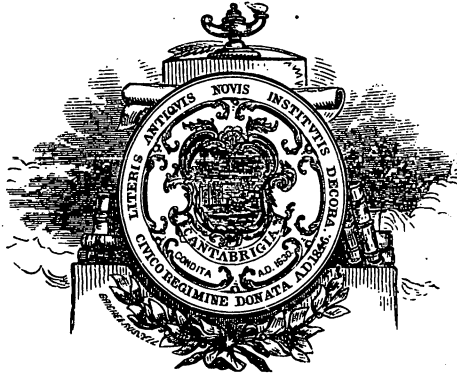


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen, Dec 29 1886

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that North Avenue and Cedar Street should be widened at their junction by taking for the purpose, a triangular parcel of land belonging to Heirs of Charles H. Russell, and Abel Fitch

~~and the heirs of the said Charles H. Russell~~, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on said North Avenue and Cedar Street, as comprised within the boundaries of the triangular parcel of land as aforesaid, and

as is included between the red lines shown on a plan of the aforesaid junction Street, drawn by the City Engineer, dated Nov. 30. 1886 and now before this

Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said North Avenue and Cedar Street.

Ordered That damages occasioned by said widening be estimated and awarded as follows:

That the sum of One Hundred and Ten Dollars
be and hereby is awarded to the Heirs of Charles H
Russell, and Abel Fitch for the land so taken as
aforesaid. The Mayor is hereby authorized to
draw his warrant upon the City Treasurer in favor of
the said Heirs of Charles H. Russell, and Abel Fitch
and for the sum of One Hundred and Ten Dollars
as aforesaid, the same to be charged to the appropriation
for Street Department, (widening)
