- WHEREAS:** It has come to the attention of this City Council that a tremendous unity effort, involving some fifty-eight uniformed Police Personnel took place on the night of October 30, 1981 during the visit of Vice-President George Bush, who had come to Cambridge to speak before a group at Massachusetts Institute of Technology; and
- WHEREAS:** Due to recent unfortunate events throughout this country and abroad, such as the attempted assassination of President Ronald Reagan, Pope John Paul II and the assassination of Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, comprehensive security arrangements had to be made in order to properly protect the Vice-President; and
- WHEREAS:** This effort, under the direction of City Manager Robert Healy, Acting Chief of Police Anthony Paolillo and City Solicitor Russell Higley, in conjunction with the Secret Service and with the full cooperation of State and M.D.C. Police, resulted in a very successful and safe Vice-Presidential visit, an effort which was commended for its high-level of professionalism by Special Agent in Charge Peter Rush; and
- WHEREAS:** The members of the Cambridge Police Department interacted with a group of demonstrators totalling two thousand and no incidences of violence or brutality took place, a fact for which Cambridge can be proud; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on record extending our deep appreciation for a "job well done"; and be it further
