WHEREAS:

Abbott O. Paine, a former employee of the School Dept. of the City of Cambridge, entered the service of the School Department on September 1, 1915 and was pensioned on November 1, 1947 and died on October 17, 1972, having served not less than thirty-two years, and

WHEREAS:

At the time of his death said employee had no rights to elect that benefits be paid to his survivor, said employee leaves as his survivor, his widow, Mrs. Ethel M. Paine, who has not remarried and is not receiving any retirement allowance or pension under the provisions of any general or special law, therefore be it


ORDERED:

That, under the provisions of Section 95A of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, Tercentenary Edition and amendments thereto, that in order to promote the public good in and in consideration of the long and meritorious service performed by Abbott O. Paine, an annuity be granted to Mrs. Ethel M. Paine, widow of Abbott O. Paine of \$1,680.00 per year as long as she does not remarry.

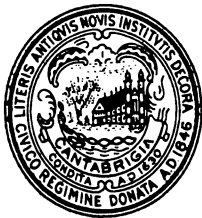
