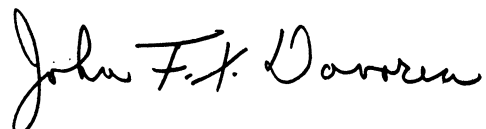

1. To further the appearance of fiction by new and un-established authors, in both traditional and experimental forms.

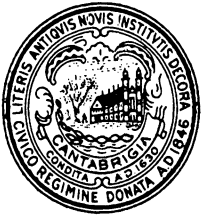
2. To explore methods of inexpensive, artistic and effective production of new fiction.

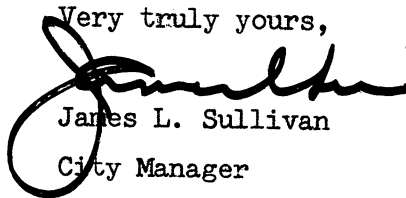
