VICE MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: There are nine clubs associated with Harvard University that bar women from membership, and;
- WHEREAS: These Clubs function to provide contacts with alumni as well as between students and, like other segregated institutions, foster unequal opportunity; and
- WHEREAS: The functioning of these Cambridge Clubs furthers the socialization of men to view women only as dates and not as colleagues; and
- WHEREAS: Students continue to challenge the practice of barring women from these Clubs; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council, in keeping with its traditional support for equality, calls upon the final Clubs to end their gender discrimination and to open their doors to membership by women.
