AN ORDER CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1975

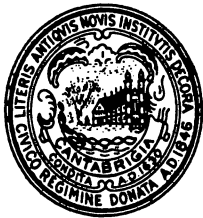

To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am pleased to inform the City Council that there is an increase in funds of \$835,995 available for appropriation in this fiscal year under contract with the United States Department of Labor. These funds are available through Title I of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973 (CETA) to provide training for unskilled economically disadvantaged Cambridge residents.

Of this amount, \$634,275 will be used by the Cambridge Economic Opportunity Committee, Inc. to provide the following job training services:

Skill and Career Training. Offered in a variety of fields, such as welding, drafting and computer programming. Training usually takes place both in classrooms and workshops.

Education Services. Training in a classroom setting for those participants whose educational attainments or English-speaking ability are not sufficient for him/her to obtain and/or retain a job at a decent living wage.

On-The-Job Training. Training in an employer's plant in which the participant is hired as a regular employee of the company and learns, primarily on the company's production line, all the skills necessary to a job.

Work Experience. Training on the job site of a public or private-non-profit employer, for participants who have some of the skills necessary to a job but who have any of a variety of disqualifications which preclude their holding a regular job.

Supportive Services. Services, such as day care, legal assistance, transportation, health care, or other needs of the participant related to the participant's continuation in the program.

Placement Services. Services by trained employment counselors in order to place participants in unsubsidized employment, in jobs which will allow the participants to provide themselves and their families

with decent living conditions and to become productive members of society.

In addition, the EMHRDA central administrative staff will use \$182,000 to provide:

Payment of training stipends, in the amount of \$60,000, to Cambridge residents.

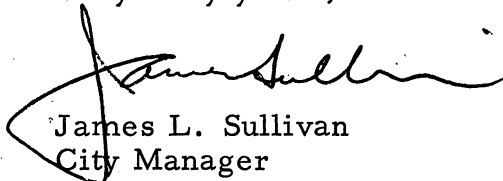
Payment to O.J.T. contractors in the amount of \$72,000 for the training of Cambridge residents.

Consortium-wide training classes, such as the reading diagnostic workshop recently completed under the auspices of Northeastern University; and the Chef's Training Program currently in progress at the Sheraton Boston Hotel, a twenty-six week program training sixteen participants to prepare for this highly-paid profession, in the amount of \$50,000.

In order to provide these services, there is a small increase required in EMHRDA central administrative staff salaries in the amount of \$19,720.

Passage of the attached order is recommended.
