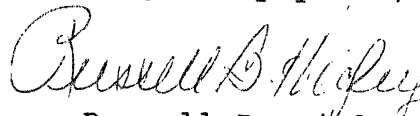

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TRAFFIC DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE PARKING OF VEHICLES IN RESIDEN- TIAL AREAS OF SAID CITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Clause (a) of section 3 of chapter 455 of the acts of 1961, as amended by section 7 of chapter 786 of the acts of 1962, and as amended by chapter 340 of the acts of 1972, is hereby further amended by inserting in the second sentence of said chapter 340, after the words "chapter ninety", the words "section 2", so that said second sentence shall now read as follows:-- Any rule or regulation adopted under this clause, prohibiting parking or standing of vehicles on the whole or any part or parts of one or more streets, ways, highways, roads or parkways under the control of the city, may provide that it shall not apply in such residential areas as shall be specified, and at such times as shall be prescribed, in such rule or regulation, to any motor vehicle registered under chapter ninety, section 2 of the General Laws as principally garaged in the city and owned or used by a person residing in such area who, in the year in which such vehicle is

parked or in the preceding December for such year, shall have given, by a writing executed in such form and detail as such rule or regulation shall prescribe, and filed with the chief of police, notice of intention to park in such area and shall display in a conspicuous place on such vehicle, while parked, such visible evidence of the giving of such notice as such rule or regulation shall prescribe; but neither the giving of such notice nor the issuance of visible evidence of the giving thereof shall be construed to assign any specific space to any person or vehicle.

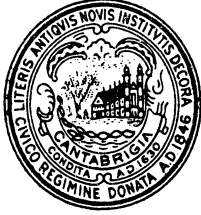

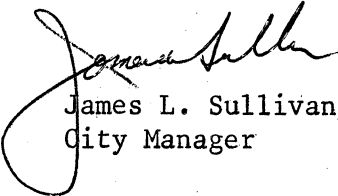

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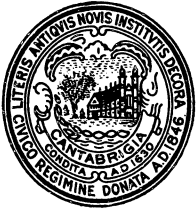
