MAYOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: Mrs. Mattye Whyte Woodbridge of Helena, Arkansas originally conceived the idea of having set aside time to honor the Country's Educators, by a nine year nation wide letter writing campaign; and
- WHEREAS: The Congress of the United States of America did proclaim the first Tuesday in March as National Teacher's Day in 1953; and
- WHEREAS: President Carter did in fact proclaim in 1980 "Teachers' Day, United States of America; and
- WHEREAS: Since Tuesday, March 8, 1988 is the true observance of National Teachers' Day in Hamilton County; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That The Mayor of Cambridge calls upon all citizens of The City of Cambridge to "let your teacher know how terrific you are", and therefore I proclaim Tuesday, March 8, 1988, as National Teachers' Day in The City of Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a copy of this resolution be sent to Mrs. Mattye Whyte Woodbridge of Helena, Arkansas and to all teachers in the public and private schools of Cambridge.
