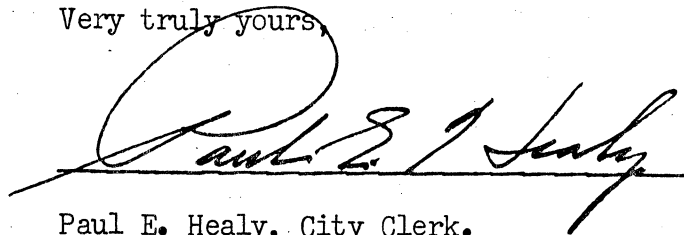

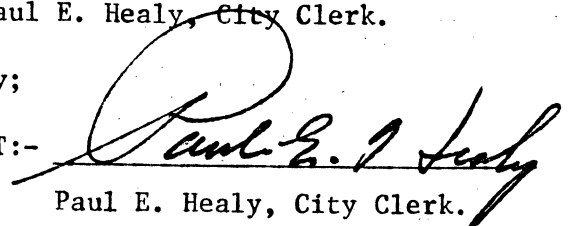

IN CITY COUNCIL
April 5, 1982

- WHEREAS: The easy availability of handguns presents an unnecessary opportunity for violent crimes and tragic accidents; and
- WHEREAS: Senate Bill No. 914, currently pending before the Joint Committee on Public Safety of the General Court, would prohibit the sale and ownership of short-barrel pistols and revolvers, thus taking a first step with these most concealable weapons; and
- WHEREAS: These short-barrel weapons have no legitimate role in sports, hunting, or target practice; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council endorses Senate Bill No. 914 and calls on the General Court to enact it promptly; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk transmit certified copies of this resolution to the members of the Cambridge legislative delegation, the chairmen of the Joint Committee on Public Safety, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

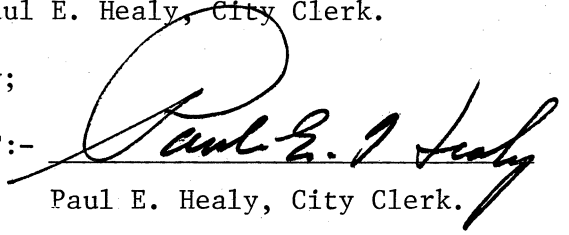
