- WHEREAS: Sunday, June 25, 2000, commemorates the 50th anniversary of the Korean War; and
- WHEREAS: Over one and a half million American men and women, representing a cross-section of the nation's population, served in the conflict as soldiers, chaplains, nurses, clerks, and other combat and support roles when called upon by their country; and
- WHEREAS: These men and women risked their lives in service to their country and for the preservation of democratic principles abroad; and
- WHEREAS: American soldiers helped comprise the United Nations forces engaged in preserving the peace, freedom and prosperity of the Republic of Korea, strengthening the bonds of friendship throughout the nations of the world; and
- WHEREAS: By July 27, 1953, at the war's end, close to 34,000 service members had sacrificed their lives and over 7,000 soldiers had suffered as Prisoners of War in the fight for freedom; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council joins the rest of the country in honoring the veterans of the Korean War and the men and women who supported our soldiers in battle; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That all residents of Cambridge express their deepest gratitude to the service members and families of service members who fought in the Korean War; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council wishes to especially recognize and remember the soldiers and the families of soldiers who gave their lives in the Korean War, languished as Prisoners of War, and were reported as Missing in Action.
