Subject City Council Order #21 of 9/24/90 Re: Towing Illegally Parked Vehicles
in Handicapped Zones

There is a regulation in effect right now authorizing the Police to tow vehicles who are illegally parked in handicapped spaces or in front of handicapped ramps.

This Regulation Article 16.3, Section d authorized by Chapter 90 Section 2 of the General Laws of the Commonwealth states that when signs are posted stating "Handicap Parking Tow Away" any vehicle not bearing a Handicap plate or placard or a Disabled Veterans Plate can be tagged and towed.

The Traffic Department's procedures on finding a vehicle illegally parked in a Handicap parking space is to tag the vehicle and immediately notify the Police Department who then take the necessary steps to tow the vehicle.
