This will acknowledge receipt of the resolution passed by the City Council of Cambridge regarding human resources and the elderly.

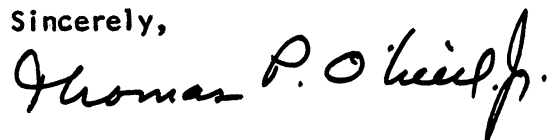
