An Ordinance.

Requiring the appointment of a Superintendent for the Public Schools.

Be it ordained by the City Council, of the City of Cambridge as follows.

1. That The School Committee of Cambridge, are required to appoint a Superintendent of the Public Schools for the current ^{municipal} ~~of fiscal~~ year, who shall have the care and supervision of said Schools, under the direction and control, of said School Committee, Said appointment to be made ~~during the~~ ~~month of July~~ ~~instant~~ before the first day of September next.

2. That The Salary of said Superintendent is fixed at twelve hundred dollars per annum, and he shall receive a proportionate amount for any term of service less than one year.
