- WHEREAS: The National League of Cities' strength and influence come from the more than 135,000 local officials it represents in cities and towns across the country; and
- WHEREAS: The core beliefs in the plan reflect the values that will guide the National League of Cities work in the coming years and can serve as a set of shared values for all cities and state municipal leagues; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council endorses the National League of Cities Strategic Plan and the core beliefs which are as follows:
- Representative, participatory local government;
 - Local government as the cornerstone of government in the United States;
 - The value of public service;
 - Municipal authority over municipal issues;
 - A commitment to the highest ethical standards among all public officials;
 - Civility and mutual respect;
 - Anticipating the needs of communities and developing strategies to meet those needs and improve the quality of life; and
 - Partnerships, coalitions and collaborations to strengthen cities and our advocacy efforts.
