In the event that all four new medallions are not issued to existing medallion holders by July 1, 1996, any remaining medallions would be offered to the general public.

10) Any new medallions issued will have limited or no value depending on the vote of the Commission.

(For the purposes of these recommendations, "accessible vehicle" shall mean a vehicle which conforms to all accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and to standards established by the Cambridge License Commission.)

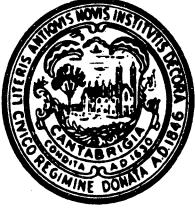

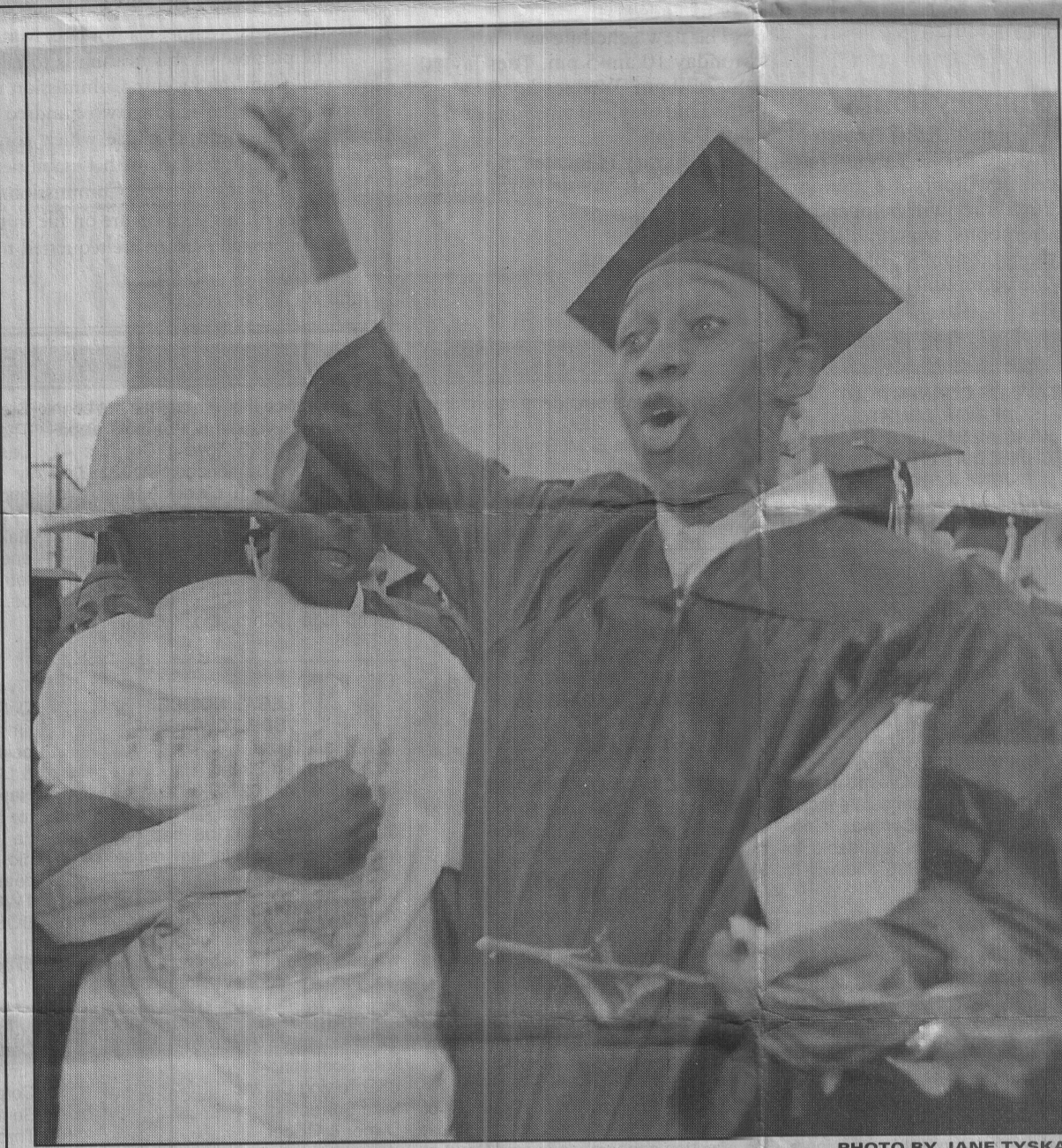

Right to beg upheld in court ruling on Cambridge case

A man arrested in 1992 by Cambridge police for begging in Harvard Square won a legal victory Tuesday when a Middlesex Superior Court judge struck down the state law that makes it a crime to beg.

Craig Benefit, homeless at the time of his arrest, sued the city claiming his right to free speech was violated. Judge Catherine White agreed, ruling that peaceful begging is speech protected by the First Amendment to the US Constitution.

Benefit was arrested several times for holding up a sign asking for help in Harvard Square. On his behalf, the American Civil Liberties Union filed suit when Cambridge refused to alter its policy of arresting people for peaceful begging.

"There are narrower tools avail-

able to prevent any conduct which is criminal without declaring criminal all people peacefully asking for help," said attorney Sarah Wunsch of the ACLU, who represented Benefit along with the firm of Stern, Shapiro, Weissberg and Garin.

Following decisions by courts from other states, Judge White found no distinction between speech in which a person asks for help for themselves and speech in which charities solicit help for others.

The US Supreme Court has already held that charitable solicitation is protected by the First Amendment. Judge White also ruled that Cambridge violated Benefit's right to equal protection of the laws by arresting him for begging while allowing groups to solicit for other causes.

'E-Call' puts recycling at your fingertips

Dialing RECYCLE, (732-9253), connects callers to a statewide recycling hotline dubbed "E-Call." After calling, touch-tone in your zip code and hear a voice mail message packed with the latest details on recycling in Cambridge.

The hotline provides fast answers to common questions. Callers can learn when the Hampshire Street recycling center is open or when the next household hazardous waste collection day is.

Messages are updated regularly to notify residents of changes and improvements to Cambridge's recycling program.

The "E-Call" program is non-profit and supported locally by the Cambridge Savings Bank.

"E-Call shows what can happen when businesses which are interested in promoting recycling join forces with the environmental groups and government to solve our most pressing environmental problems," said Trudy Cox, Massachusetts secretary of environmental affairs.

Approximately 200 composters will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Additional bins will be available for \$32 plus tax.

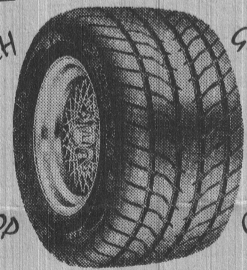

The Committee heard from Jeanne Burton who stated her support for the proposal. However, she asked how will service to the elderly and handicapped persons be done by the radio servers. Mr. Muehe responded that the License Commission would require the recipient of the accessible taxi medallions subscribe to a radio service, the radio was to be left on at all times and that cellular phones will be required equipment in the cabs to insure that they would be reachable at any times.

Mr. Scali stated that the cost for the vans was in the range of \$15,000 to \$30,000. Mr. Joseph W. Silva, 76 Hampshire Street, responded that 90% of the taxi industry does not buy new vehicles, that a new van equipped with the necessary equipment costs at least \$30,000 and that the insurance on a new vehicle is more expensive than on a taxi cab. Mr. Muehe responded that the additional insurance was needed by the bank for financing the vehicle.

Councillor Toomey asked if the individuals or the companies would own the medallions. Mr. Scali responded that the radio server would own the medallions.

Councillor Davis questioned the ownership of the medallions and Mr. Scali stated that it would be lifetime ownership.

Mr. Benjamin Barnes, Commissioner, License Commission stated that public hearings were held by the License Commission and no one appeared against the proposal. He stated that the disagreement was with the issue of value/no value, the number of medallions, lottery, owners or radio service ownership. He stated that the type of vehicle used is important and that it must meet the ADA requirements.

The Committee heard from Mr. Lawrence Prift, 289 Pearl Street # 3, who stated that he supported the proposal but felt that a "service plan" should be filed with the License Commission by the Accessible Taxi medallion recipient. The "service plan" should contain an understanding of what the service is about, competence and how do they plan to use the accessible taxi van. The obligation should be to the ADA client and there should be a coordination of transportation with other providers such as The Ride. Enforcement of the "service plan" by Officer Lashley was important.

Vice Mayor Born asked if the vans would be equipped with lifts. Mr. Muehe stated that not necessarily a fold down ramp or lift would be sufficient.

Ms. Jill Herold, Assistant City Manager for Human Services, stated that an Accessible Taxi medallion could only be reserved by an ADA client.

Councillor Davis stated that the medallion should be renewable after one year. Mr. Muehe stated that if there was a limit of one year the bank may not give funding for the van.

Mr. Scali stated that the License Commission has the power to suspend or revoke any medallion if there are complaints.

Councillor Davis expressed the need for monitoring of this service. Mr. Barnes, License Commissioner, stated that the recommendations from the License Commission contain how they will be monitored. Service will be provided twenty-four hours a day, and License Commission will monitor taxi cabs and that they will be trained like the other taxi cabs in the city.

Councillor Toomey stated that there are a lot of unanswered questions and he would like these issues resolved before the hearing before the full City Council on Monday, June 24, 1996.

Mr. Barnes responded that there will never be a unified agreement due to the different parties involved.

Ms. Jeanne Burton stressed the need for monthly reports or monitoring. Councillor Davis applauded the idea, but wondered how the program would work without monitoring or enforcement. Mr. Barnes responded that the License Commission will monitor this program by the Way Bill, if notes about accessible service were added to the Way Bill.

Mr. Muehe stated that the Disabilities Commission receives complaints and that the License Commission takes action on these complaints. He stated that he believes the License Commission will enforce their regulations and the Disabilities Commission will also monitor this program. He stated that Boston uses a "User Response Card" to be filled out by the ADA client to monitor the program.

The Committee heard from Mr. Joseph W. Silva who stated that monitoring is easy, a log is kept which lists the number of calls and how many were serviced and the reasons why they were not serviced. However, he stated, by making the van a taxi cab the driver will be doing other work.

Councillor Davis stated that she has received complaints from senior citizens about the Senior Center. Ms. Herold stated that there are problems and when the problems are brought to the License Commission's attention these problems are addressed. Monitoring of four medallions, she stated, would be more manageable. Councillor Davis stated that a taxi stand in front of the Senior Center would increase the use of taxi cabs.

Councillor Davis questioned if the lottery had been designed by the License Commission. Mr. Scali responded that it would be a random choice lottery with a requirement that the applicant have five years experience.

Councillor Davis inquired if the License Commission recommendations would be amended to include the provision for the filing of a "service plan". Mr. Scali stated that it could be incorporated into the lottery system.

Councillor Davis stated that it was brave experiment, but she would like the medallion to be issued for three years with an option to renew. Mr. Barnes stated that if the service was not provided the medallion would be revoked. Councillor Davis asked how could this be done. Mr. Barnes stated that if complaints are received mechanisms are in place to revoke the medallion. The medallions, he stated, are always the property of the City of Cambridge.

Officer Lasley stated that he had pulled medallions off of taxi cabs. He stated that the "service plan" should be approved by the License Commission.

Councillor Davis stated that we could have four different plans for four different medallions. Competition, she stated, brings out the best in people. Mr. Lawrence Prift stated that the service should be divided into categories and then define the "service plans". We have four different ways to provide the services. Officer Lashley stated that there are 248 medallions in the city plus four different "service plans" which would need to be enforced and that this would be difficult. Mr. Muehe stated that the two concepts could be combined: minimum standards for "service plans" be established by the License Commission and the aspects to be added are hours of service, area of service and training of drivers.

Councillor Davis stated that she would like to hear that Cambridge instituted this service and it works.

The Committee heard from Mr. Ray Walsh, 37 Hollis Street #N, Pepperel, who stated that the vans would be a taxi cab 98% of the time and an accessible taxi 2% of the time. In response to this statement, Councillor Davis stated she wanted the ADA clients serviced as the major part of the proposal. Ms. Herold stated that we can advertise this service so that the potential users know it is out there and it is being used.

Mr. Larry Prift stated that the statement of intention is what the "service plan" should contain. Councillor Davis stated we need to do outreach to the community. Mr. Scali stated that there are contracts available where accessible vans can be used. Officer Lashley stated there could be a stipulation that accessible vans could not service hotels.

The Committee heard from John Sorenski, taxi driver, who stated that he does not see the demand for this service. He suggested to add two accessible taxi medallions with the option of increasing the number to four after there is feed back for the service. The vans, he stated, are going to have to work as a full service taxi with the cost of the van and the insurance. He urged caution on this proposal.

Councillor Davis stated that the development of a "service plan" will create additional business for the taxi industry. Mr. Muehe stated that Boston's plan was experimental and they are out there providing the service.

Vice Mayor Born questioned if an elderly person who was not handicapped would have a problem getting into the van. Mr. Muehe stated that the ramps are easier for the elderly. He further stated that there are specific design standards by the ADA for the vans which include design guidelines for persons who use walkers or canes. Vice Mayor Born stated that there is a potential for business that includes persons other than the elderly or handicapped.

The meeting adjourned at eleven o'clock and fifty-five minutes p.m.

Recommendations to City Council

The following was heard on May 14, 1996 and voted on May 30, 1996 by the License Commission, 3-0.

The License Commission heard and considered the report of the Accessible Taxicab Committee. A copy of their report is enclosed dated April 16, 1996.

The following are the final recommendations of the License Commission:

- 1) All accessible taxicabs shall serve the whole community, not just persons with disabilities. The elderly and disabled will be given priority. Such service shall be available 24 hours a day.
- 2) All accessible taxicabs shall be required to be on a radio service and if an accessible taxicab is unavailable, as a courtesy, a call shall be made to another radio service to provide an accessible to a customer.
- 3) It is suggested that radio services dedicate a line for accessible taxicab requests but not eliminate other available lines for service.
- 4) Each owner of an accessible taxicab may choose the kind of van he/she will buy so long as it meets ADA requirements. The committee felt a reasonable product was available for those interested in converting a medallion to an accessible van. Either a used van or new van is available and the committee will not specify which can be used so long as it meets ADA requirements.
- 5) All drivers of accessible vans must be trained for handling such van and loading and unloading of passengers either by classes held by the taxicab school or some other course specializing in such training.

6) Accessible taxicabs must have use of the taxicab stands and be able to be hailed off the street just as any taxicab may.

7) The Commission recommends that the City Council issue four new taxicab medallions for accessible taxicab vehicles.

8) Said new medallions would initially be offered by a lottery system for anyone who can show that he or she has experience in the taxicab business for at least 5 years. A date certain should be set for anyone to apply to put their name into the lottery.

9) Any new medallions issued will have no value.

(For the purposes of these recommendations, "accessible vehicle" shall mean a vehicle which conforms to all accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and to standards established by the Cambridge License Commission.)

All existing Cambridge medallion holders were informed in writing by the License Commission of the hearings held, available vehicle conversion and financing options, and were given 30 days to respond from the date of mailing.

This recommendation should now be passed on to the City Council for hearing on the above. Please inform me of the date it will be heard so that I may inform all interested parties and the committee.

Re: Accessible Taxicab Committee

The following was heard and voted on March 22, 1996 by the committee.

The committee got down to the final business of voting on recommendations to the License Commission which will go to the City Manager for the City Council. The License Commission will hear these recommendations on May 14, 1996 at 6:00 p.m., 831 Mass. Ave., 2nd floor. Please review the following for errors or omissions as this is a compilation of our meetings for the past two years. Notify me by April 26th of any changes or errors that were voted upon.

The following are the final recommendations of the Accessible Taxicab Committee:

- 1) All accessible taxicabs shall serve the whole community, not just persons with disabilities. The elderly and disabled will be given priority. Such service shall be available 24 hours a day.
- 2) All accessible taxicabs shall be required to be on a radio service and if an accessible taxicab is unavailable, as a courtesy, a call shall be made to another radio service to provide an accessible to a customer.
- 3) It is suggested that radio services dedicate a line for accessible taxicab requests but not eliminate other available lines for service.
- 4) Each owner of an accessible taxicab may choose the kind of van he/she will buy so long as it meets ADA requirements. The committee felt a reasonable product was available for those interested in converting a medallion to an accessible van. Either a used van or new van is available and the committee will not specify which can be used so long as it meets ADA requirements.

5) All drivers of accessible vans must be trained for handling such van and loading and unloading of passengers either by classes held by the taxicab school or some other course specializing in such training.

6) Accessible taxicabs must have use of the taxicab stands and be able to be hailed off the street just as any taxicab may.

7) The Committee on Accessible Taxicabs recommends that the Cambridge License Commission submit a proposal to the City Council to issue four new taxicab medallions for accessible taxicab vehicles by May 1, 1996.

8) Said new medallions would initially be offered, according to procedures established by the License Commission to ensure equitable distribution, to each existing medallion holder provided he/she commits to converting an existing medallion to an accessible vehicle.

9) In the event that at least four existing Cambridge medallion holders voluntarily commit to converting to an accessible vehicle before May 1, 1996, the issuance of new medallions would be postponed for one year. In the event that all four new medallions are not issued to existing medallion holders by July 1, 1996, any remaining medallions would be offered to the general public.

10) Any new medallions issued will have limited or no value depending on the vote of the Commission.

(For the purposes of these recommendations, "accessible vehicle" shall mean a vehicle which conforms to all accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and to standards established by the Cambridge License Commission.)

All existing Cambridge medallion holders were informed in writing by the License Commission of the available vehicle conversion and financing options, and were given 30 days to respond from the date of mailing.

City of Cambridge

The Traffic and Transportation Committee held a public meeting on Wednesday, June 19, 1996 at ten o'clock and ten minutes a.m. in the Ackermann Room.

Present at this meeting were: Councillor Henrietta Davis, Chair of the Committee; Councillor Toomey; Vice Mayor Born; Jill Herold, Assistant City Manager for Human Services; Benjamin Barnes, License Commissioner; Richard Scali, Executive Director of the License Commission; Leon Lashley, Hackney Officer; Michael Muehe, Persons with Disabilities Commission; members of the Accessible Taxicab Committee: Lawrence Prift, Joseph W. Silva, Jean Larrame, Ray Walsh, Ribert Montout, Arthur Santoro and Jeanne Burton; and James Henry, taxicab industry and Donna P. Lopez, Interim Deputy City Clerk.

At this time Councillor Davis requested Richard Scali to outline the proposal which was recommended by the License Commission. Mr. Scali stated that the Accessible Taxicab Committee has met for two years on the accessible taxicab medallions proposal. He reviewed the recommendations contained in his communication dated May 31, 1996, a copy of which is attached as ATTACHMENT A. Mr. Scali stated that four medallions would be issued for accessible taxi use and would be an opportunity for someone to get into the business since they have no value.

In response to a question on the lottery process by Councillor Davis, Mr. Scali stated that the applications would be due by a certain date and the names would be pulled out of a hat.

Councillor Davis questioned the profitability of the accessible taxi service. Mr. Scali responded that they would benefit as a taxi driver but would have to service the elderly and the handicapped.

Councillor Davis asked Mr. Scali how many radio services there were in the city. Mr. Scali answered that there were four in the city: Checker, Union, Ambassador Brattle/Yellow of these only Checker owns medallions. The owners or drivers would be required to subscribe to a radio service under the License Commission recommendations.

The Committee heard from Mr. Arthur Santoro, 17 Acadia Park, Somerville who stated that he would like to see six medallions issued -- two for each of the taxi companies.

The Committee heard from Mr. Michael Muehe, Persons with Disabilities Commission, who stated his commission's support for the proposal and commended the Accessible Taxi Committee for the work on the proposal. He stated that the Accessible Taxi Committee held open public meetings to solicit information from the taxi industry. He stated that the Accessible Taxi medallions should be integrated with the overall taxi fleet in the city. He felt that there would be a greater demand for this service due to the fact they would be servicing the elderly and the handicapped as well as the regular clientele.

A communication was received Donna Lopes Interim Deputy City Clerk, a report from Councillor Davis, Chair, Traffic and Transportation Committee for meeting held on June 19, 1996 for the purpose of considering the addition of four new accessible taxicab medallions to the existing two hundred forty-eight medallions.
