In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-one.
An Ordinance for the renumbering
of the Streets of the City.

As is ordained, &c.

The Board of Aldermen shall have power to cause numbers in regular series to be affixed to, or inscribed on, all dwelling-houses and other buildings erected or fronting on any street, lane, alley, or public court within the city of Cambridge, at their discretion; and shall also have power to determine the form, size, and material of such numbers, and the mode, place, succession, and order of inscribing or affixing them on their respective houses or other buildings. And any owner or occupant of any building or part of a building who shall neglect or refuse to affix to the same the number designated by the Board of Aldermen, or by some person by them duly authorized, or who shall affix to the same, or retain thereon more than one day, any number contrary to the direction of the said board, or person so authorized, shall forfeit and pay a sum not less than one dollar, nor more than twenty dollars, and a like sum for every subsequent offence.
