- WHEREAS: This City Council heard from residents and neighbors abutting the Otis Hospital, 85 Otis Street, on a proposed petition by Enoble Corporation, 457 Mount Auburn Street, Cambridge for the transfer of the site of The Journey House from 775 Trapelo Road, Waltham to 85 Otis Street and to amend the approved project by increasing the approved maximum capital expenditure by \$2,352,126.; and
- WHEREAS: Enoble Corporation has demonstrated and exhibited a lack of neighborly spirit by its failure to communicate and brief area residents regarding the proposed use of the facility; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That this City Council go on record opposing the proposed transfer of Enoble Corporation's approved Determination of Need from its present location to the Otis Street location; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this City Council urges the Department of Public Health, through its Determination of Need Program to conduct a public hearing in order for area residents to be fully briefed and to make objections known regarding this proposed use.
