COUNCILLOR MYERS

- WHEREAS: Tuesday, January 30, 1990 marked a candlelight vigil remembering the tragic deaths of Jessie McKie and Rigoberto Carrion; and
- WHEREAS: More than 500 people turned out to express their support to the families of the victims; and
- WHEREAS: The vigil marked a major step forward in the effort by Newtowne Court/Washington Elms and Area 4 residents to reclaim their community and to stop the senseless violence which is afflicting their neighborhood; and
- WHEREAS: Many individuals and organizations came together in an extraordinary way to respond to this situation and to express their support to the families of the victims and the affected communities; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record expressing its appreciation to all those involved including the Margaret Fuller House, the Cambridge Black Pastors Conference, the Washington Elms/Newtowne Court Tenants Council, the Cambridge Rainbow, the Area 4 Crime Task Force, and Consilio Hispano, the Cambridge Housing Authority, and the Department of Public Works, the Guardian Angels, the Cambridge Clergy, Cambridge Civic Organizations and all the people of Cambridge; ; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record expressing its appreciation to the Cambridge Police Department, for its support in covering the march; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the effort begun on January 30th, only prove to be the beginning of a process of commitment to the above named organizations and the city to improving the living conditions of our cities residents and providing increased opportunities for the young people of the City.
