WHEREAS: Marc Hoffman is also the first participant in the Com/Electric rebate program, and the Executive Director of Consortium for Energy Efficiency (CEE); and

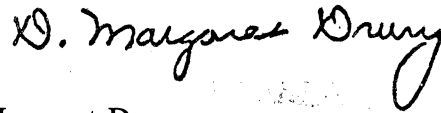
