RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does hereby sincerely thank the Cambridge African American History Project for four years of hard work on behalf of this City, and for the wonderful and seminal fruit of its labors, THE AFRICAN AMERICAN EXPERIENCE IN CAMBRIDGE: A TEACHER'S RESOURCE GUIDE; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does hereby thank all of the institutions and Departments which contributed to the realization of this project, including the Offices of the Mayor and City Manager, Cambridge Discovery, the Cambridge Historical Commission, the Cambridge Historical Society, Cambridge Rindge and Latin School, Harvard University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, The Cambridge Public Library, the Longfellow House/National Park Service, the Cambridge Multicultural Arts Center, and the Museum of Afro-American History.
