WHEREAS: Cambridge has been awarded a Municipal Recycling Grant in the amount of \$8,610; and

WHEREAS: This Market Services Grant will help offset the costs of recycling leaded cathode ray tubes (CRTs) found in televisions and computer monitors and mercury-bearing wastes; and

WHEREAS: Since 1990, the EOEa and DEP have granted over \$17 million in recycling equipment, household hazardous waste equipment, educational materials and technical assistance to municipalities throughout the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS: These grants play a significant role in building Massachusetts' recycling infrastructure, helping to make recycling more cost effective for municipalities and reducing environmental and health impacts of waste management; and

WHEREAS: According to David B. Struhs, Commissioner of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection, "Cambridge was selected for a grant because your program demonstrates a commitment to enhancing your recycling program;" and

WHEREAS: Cambridge has shown through its actions the dedication of its citizens to recycling and its continued efforts to find new and innovative solutions to environmental issues; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record thanking Jan Aceti, Director of Recycling, and the Department of Public Works for their outstanding devotion to keeping Cambridge beautiful and environmentally healthy, on behalf of the City of Cambridge, congratulate them on the Municipal Recycling Grant that has been awarded to Cambridge; and be it further
