WHEREAS: By act of Congress, the third Monday of January is celebrated as the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday; and

WHEREAS: This holiday celebrates the moral and social leadership of a man who through the power of non-violence led millions of Americans in bringing the evil of segregation to its knees; and helped guide our nation from the shadows of hatred into the fine light of love; and

WHEREAS: The spirit of community service by which Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. lived should be a model for every human being who would advance the cause of justice; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Black Pastors Conference was organized to address the civic and spiritual needs of all Cantabrigians, regardless of color, creed, or gender; and

WHEREAS: Every year, the Cambridge Black Pastors Conference holds the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Convocation, where it honors some individual who tries to live by the principle of selfless dedication to the public good embodied by that greatest of Black pastors, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and

WHEREAS: The Award is called the Winona Rose Boardley Award, in honor of a Cantabrigian who spent her life dedicated to addressing the concerns of our community; and

WHEREAS: At the 6th Annual Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Convocation, long time resident, employee, activist, and friend of the City of Cambridge, Mrs. Zelma Evelyn, shall be awarded the Winona Rose Boardley Award, for her great achievements in improving the quality of life for the citizens of the City, through her work and ministry, much of its within these very walls, with children and others in need in the community, as well as her endeavors to broaden the cultural

landscape of the City and bring to light the proud heritage of African Americans, all of this being done without regard to self-aggrandizement or thought of personal gain; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council joins the Black Pastors Conference in honoring the memories of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and of Winona Rose Boardley, as well as in honoring the current work of Zelma Evelyn; and be it further

RESOLVED: That all Cambridge residents are encouraged to support the 6th Annual Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Convocation to be held on Sunday, January 15, 1995, and to uphold the spirit of community service by which Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. lived.
