WHEREAS: This informative exhibition will consist of a presentation by Cambridge artist, Karen Norberg, addressing sexuality and self-preservation in the area of AIDS; and

WHEREAS: On February 6, 1993, Margaret Fuller Neighborhood House will host a public forum in collaboration with the artist on the creation of art, and the relationship of art, social action and AIDS prevention; and

WHEREAS: To meet and for conversational exchanges with the artist and her collaborators a public reception will be held on February 11, 1993 at Gallery 57; and

WHEREAS: Other events include a February 18th Roundtable Discussion Art and AIDS Activism, and HIV and Prevention on February 25th at Gallery 57; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council earnestly urge each individual to become strong advocates in the struggle to halt the spread of this dreaded disease and to render comfort and assistance to those persons presently afflicted.
