

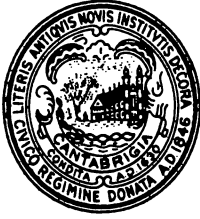

To the Honorable, the City Council:


I am pleased to inform the City Council that on December 23, 1976, we received a "grant offer" of \$1,729,962.00 from the U.S. Department of Commerce for the construction of the East Cambridge Fire Station. This money will be provided under terms and provisions of the Local Public Works Capital Development and Investment Act of 1976. We have learned from the Economic Development Administration, which is responsible for administering the new Act, that the original grant applications from Massachusetts exceeded 700 in number and \$900 million in value. Of these, only 33 communities were successful in the competition for the \$52.3 million allotted to the Commonwealth by the Commerce Department.

As you may recall, an appropriation of \$1,130,000 for the Fire Station was approved on May 5, 1975. Of this amount, \$430,000 for design and site acquisition costs was to be financed by the First Year Community Development Block Grant, and \$700,000 for construction costs was to be financed by a bond issue. With this grant award, we are now able to make up for the effects of inflation on construction costs as well as providing for improved site development, street/sidewalk rehabilitation and traffic signal modernization. The grant will also provide funds for moving and rehabilitation costs that the City may provide to the owner of the building currently occupying the site.

Last and most importantly, the City will be able to fulfill its commitment to the completion of this project without increasing its bonded indebtedness at a crucial time in its effort to maintain its favorable position in the investment community.

For all these reasons, I recommend passage of the attached orders.
